# Message from Mrs Peart

# Reading books going home

We are in the process of moving to a new approach to the reading books that children choose to take home each week and as part of these changes, the books that we use in school are being updated. Many of the books that we have on our corridor are no longer appropriate for the children to read alongside the Read, Write Inc books that we also send home. Over the next few weeks, we will be updating the books that children can choose to take home from the corridor, and these books will be known as our Reading for Pleasure' books which the children may not be able to read independently, but rather enjoy with a grown up at home at bedtime. These books will have a special Reading for Pleasure' sticker on them and will be used alongside the Read, Write Inc books that will be sent home for children to practice reading independently. As we are making these changes, your child will be able to choose a book from their classroom or can read a selection of books you may have at home. Please continue marking their reading in their diary each week!

In the afternoon of the Garden Party on Friday 27<sup>th</sup> May, we will put out the reading books that we will not be using in school anymore for parents to take to read at home with their children. These are available free of charge so please feel free to bring a

carrier bag and take plenty!

### Platinum Jubilee Celebrations

On Friday 27<sup>th</sup> May, we will be holding a special celebration day in school to mark the Platinum Jubilee of Queen Elizabeth. This is an amazing achievement and something that we feel is important for the children to learn more about. Children are welcome to come to school dressed in red, white and blue for the day and they will be taking part in fun activities throughout the morning, finding out about Queen Elizabeth's 70 wonderful years of service to her country. The children will be creating a special personalised tea towel to mark the occasion that will be available to purchase as a special memento of this year. In the afternoon, we are inviting all parents to come into school to join us for a special jubilee picnic on the school field. The children will make some sandwiches and treats that we will share in the afternoon, but you are more than welcome to bring a picnic of your own to enjoy in school with your child.

The afternoon will begin at 1.30pm and the picnic will be opened by the children singing a special song for parents that they have been learning. Following this, we will all sit on the school field together and hopefully enjoy a lovely afternoon in the sun! It would be helpful if you could bring along a blanket or two to sit on. For safeguarding reasons, parents can arrive from 1.15pm but must arrive by 1.30pm as the gates will be closed and there will be no one in the school office to open them after this time. Please note that the special event is subject to fair weather so fingers crossed it doesn't rain! We really hope as many of you as possible will be able to come and join us for this special afternoon.

#### Record of Achievement

All children in school will move up to their new class for three full days. You will bring and collect your children as normal and we will organise them into their new classes once we have taken the register in their existing classroom. Children will then return to their class at the end of the day ready for collection at the normal place at home time.

# Wednesday 13th July - 3-4.30pm Parent Walkabout

Parents are invited into school to speak with their child's class teacher if they have any questions about their Record of Achievement, as well as spend time visiting their child's new classroom.

#### After School Provision

Live & Learn are again offering after school clubs next half term on Tuesday's and Thursday's 3.15pm-4.15pm. The club on a Tuesday will be Cricket and this will run from Tuesday 7<sup>th</sup> June until Tuesday 12<sup>th</sup> July (6 weeks). Children can attend both clubs if this is required.
