Yorkshire & Humber School of the Year!



Brookfield Junior Academy has become the first school in Yorkshire South to be recognised as the Modeshift STARS "Yorkshire and Humber School of the Year," just months after earning their Gold Modeshift STARS award.

Since signing up to Modeshift STARS in September 2017 the percentage of pupils normally travelling to school by car fell from 41% to less than 10% by July 2019. This is a huge achievement considering that, on average, around 46% of primary school pupils are driven to school every day across England.

The school's success is largely thanks to their travel champion forming an effective working group from the outset. School staff, parents, governors, ward councillors and their local MP have all worked collaboratively to plan and deliver a range of initiatives that support active and sustainable travel to school. With help from the STARS South Yorkshire team, Rotherham Metropolitan Borough Council and local businesses, the school has improved road safety infrastructure outside school; improved the health and wellbeing of pupils; and reduced traffic, air pollution and harmful greenhouse gases.

School Principal, Mrs Liversidge said: "We are ecstatic to become Regional School of the Year 2019. Active travel is now an integral part of school life. Pupils regularly walk, cycle and scoot to school throughout the whole school year. They are able to articulate the difference active travel makes and why it is so important."

Brookfield Junior Academy is a fantastic example of how the whole community can work together to change travel behaviours through a variety of low cost initiatives. We are extremely proud that Brookfield has been recognised as Yorkshire and Humber School of the Year 2019 and must also congratulate our runner-up schools Listerdale Junior Academy and Sitwell Infant School. We hope Brookfield Junior Academy's success can inspire other schools to support happier, healthier and cleaner journeys to school. Bike donations re-cycled

Laughton All Saints Primary School have set up a bike library after receiving a set of pre-loved bikes at the end of last term. Safety checked and serviced by our STARS Active Travel Officer, the bikes were kindly donated by staff from Rotherham Metropolitan Borough Council and will enable more pupils to take part in cycling activities at school.

The bike library provides an invaluable resource for pupils that can't afford their own bikes or for those that live far from the village and are unable to access a safe route to school. The bikes open up opportunities for all pupils to get involved in cycling initiatives at school including playground skills sessions and on-road Bikeability training.

With a background in engineering, Teaching Assistant Mr Morley also plans to use the bikes to deliver cycle maintenance workshops. Pupils will be able to learn new skills and develop knowledge of how bikes work without being left unable to ride their own bikes home safely.

The project highlights how easy it is to put unwanted bikes back into use. We hope that other schools benefit from similar schemes in future. Special thanks to the Rotherham Cycle Hub who provided additional guidance and spare parts for the bikes.
