Reclaim the street!

Pupils, parents and staff at Listerdale Junior Academy made a stand against traffic and air pollution in September by hosting Rotherham's first 'car-free' road closure event. Parents and families left the car at home and instead walked, scooted and cycled to school or used the school's park and stride facility from Brecks Beefeater pub. The usual stress, traffic and danger outside school was replaced with an enjoyable space for people to live, work, learn and play together.

Last year the school's own air pollution monitoring showed that nitrogen dioxide levels

more than doubled in term-time compared to the summer holidays. Closing the school road to all but essential traffic helps to reduce pollution that can be linked to a range of health problems including asthma in children. As well as clean air, pupils also enjoyed street games, chalk art and scooter skills training on the road outside their school.

Mrs Millner, the Active Travel Champion at Listedale Academy said, "We constantly go the extra mile for our pupils because we know that the journey to school is an important part of the school day. We want everyone to arrive to school safely and encourage them to travel in a way that keeps them fit, active and healthy whilst improving air quality for all."

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Brookfield Junior Academy Goes Gold

Brookfield Junior Academy have achieved Gold Modeshift STARS accreditation after the

percentage of pupils normally travelling to school by car fell from 35% to 10% in less than 2 years.

The key to the school's success is thanks to their school champion leading an effective working group including school staff, junior road safety officers, school governors and local councillors that meet every half-term to plan, promote and review a range of initiatives that support walking, scooting and cycling to school.

Ward councillors have funded a range of road safety measures at Brookfield, including the installation of road safety signage and 20mph speed restrictions, as well as extending the yellow zig-zag lines to reduce dangerous parent parking.

The STARS South Yorkshire Team, have supported dozens of initiatives including Dr bike safety checks, puncture repair workshops, scooter skills sessions, cycle skills training, classroom activities, bike and scooter decorating workshops, led bike rides, pupil-led parking campaigns and challenges such as The Big Pedal and the 10 Day Active Travel challenge. The local Cooperative supermarket have also donated fruit as part of the school's active travel breakfasts.

In recognition for their efforts, Brookfield Junior Academy have been nominated for the Rotherham Modeshift STARS school of the year award for the second year running. They will attend the regional Modeshift STARS awards in York this November. If successful, they will compete with schools across Yorkshire and The Humber for the crown of regional school of the year before heading into the nation finals.
