They'll give you an activity stamp code so you can enter it onto CU Online and claim your CU credits towards your next award.

If you see challenges published by other CUs, then do feel free to complete them. To claim your CU credits for these, you'll need to show your work to your teacher in school, then they'll be able to give you your CU activity stamp code to add to CU Online.

Did you know?

The Passport to Learning is your key to exciting learning activities in and beyond Rotherham!

Looking for a new activity to try? Want some ideas for things to do nearby? Are you having a trip out somewhere? Going on holiday? Visiting friends and family? You can collect CU credits at museums, castles, forests, coastlines, mountains, cathedrals, zoos and lots of other famous landmarks in Rotherham and right across the UK.



1. Get ready!



- **Get a Passport to Learning.** Ask in school how you can do this.
- **Visit the website:** www.childrensuniversity.co.uk/activity-search



2. Get in on the action!

- **Use the website to find details of Learning Destinations** before you go. Why not refresh your search whilst you're out and about?
- **Visit them and learn lots!** Look out for structured learning activities such as trails, talks by experts, quizzes and workshops (remember: **only** these structured activities count towards CU credits).



3. Get your CU credits!

- **Collect your CU Activity Stamp.** Ask a member of staff at the Learning Destination for the code. Record it in your CU Passport to Learning.
- **Claim your CU credits.** Log into CU Online, enter your Activity Stamp Code and see your credits increase. Why not review the activity (tell us what you learned and what you thought about it), and we'll award some extra credits! Ask in school if you need any help.

ABOUT THE EASTER HUNT FOR LITTLE EGGSPLORERS

What are your opening times?

Brearley Bear's Easter Egg Hunt for Little Eggsplorers takes place from Monday, 11th – Saturday, 16th April. You can collect your trail map from Unit 1, Surrey Street between 9.30am – 5pm Monday to Saturday. All the 'Easter eggs' on this trail are in city centre venues, accessible between at least 10am and 4pm Monday to Saturday.

Does it cost money to complete Brearley Bear's Easter Egg hunt?

No, it's free! You can download the trail map online and print at home or pick up a trail map from Sheffield BID's Unit 1, Surrey Street (next to the Winter Garden).

How do we complete the Easter Egg Hunt?

You can hunt for the eggs in any order - there is no Start or Finish. Just remember to jot down the colour of each egg as you find it on your trail map. Once you've found all of Brearley's eggs, return the completed trail map to Sheffield BID's Unit 1 on Surrey Street (next to the Winter Garden), where children can claim a chocolate treat.

Easter Challenge: Bubble Painting

It's time to get creative and make a painting without a paintbrush! We recommend that this activity is done outdoors as it can become rather messy!

You will need:

- Paint
- Bubble Solution (or washing up liquid)
- Bubble Wand or Plastic Straw
- Cups or Small Bowls
- Paper
- Tablespoon

Step 1: Ask an adult to help you add 3 tablespoons of bubble solution (or a drop of washing up liquid) and two tablespoons of paint into a cup or small bowl.

Step 2: Mix the paint and bubble solution together.

Step 3: Place your piece of paper on to a flat surface. You might want to cover the surface first in newspaper or plastic?

Step 4: Dip the wand or straw into the bubble paint and then blow out bubbles so they land on the paper.

Step 5: Another way to create bubble paintings is to use your straw to blow bubbles into the mixture while it's in the bowl. Then take your paper and lay it over the top of the bubbles then turn it back over and reveal your artwork. You could even challenge yourself to see how many colours you can get on one page. And you could even see what happens when You mix the colours.

Step 6: Allow to dry before hanging up the colourful bubble painting!

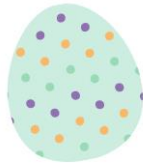

Easter Challenge: Coping Skills

Coping skills are things we can do or say to help remind us that we are strong, valuable people, even when things get hard. Each one of us have different coping skills that help us feel better during tough times.

You will need:

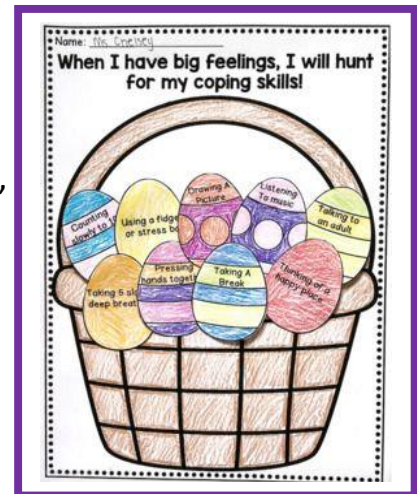
- Paper
- Scissors
- Colouring pencils
- Glue/Sticky tape

What do you do that makes you feel calmer when things feel more difficult? You might count slowly to 10 and take big deep breaths. You may find it helpful to talk to a friend or family member about how you feel. Or it might help you to get creative and draw a picture, read a book or listen to music, or maybe being more active and going for a walk or dancing?

This activity will help you create your very own Easter basket full of coping skills, giving you the tools you need to help you deal with challenging situations.

Step 1: Print and carefully cut out the Easter basket and egg templates below. If you don't have a printer, you could always draw your own eggs and Easter basket and use those!

Step 2: Think about what coping skills help you feel calmer when things feel more difficult and make a list. Include as many as you can think of!



Step 3: Colour in and decorate your Easter basket, then decorate your Easter eggs, writing one of your coping skills on each egg. Stick these onto your basket and voila! You have now created your very own Easter basket full of coping skills as a reminder of how you can help yourself feel better during tough times.

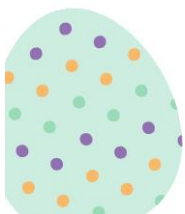
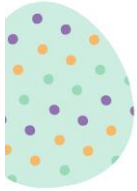
Top Tip: Before you stick your eggs to your basket, why not hide them around your house and garden and have a coping skills egg hunt?

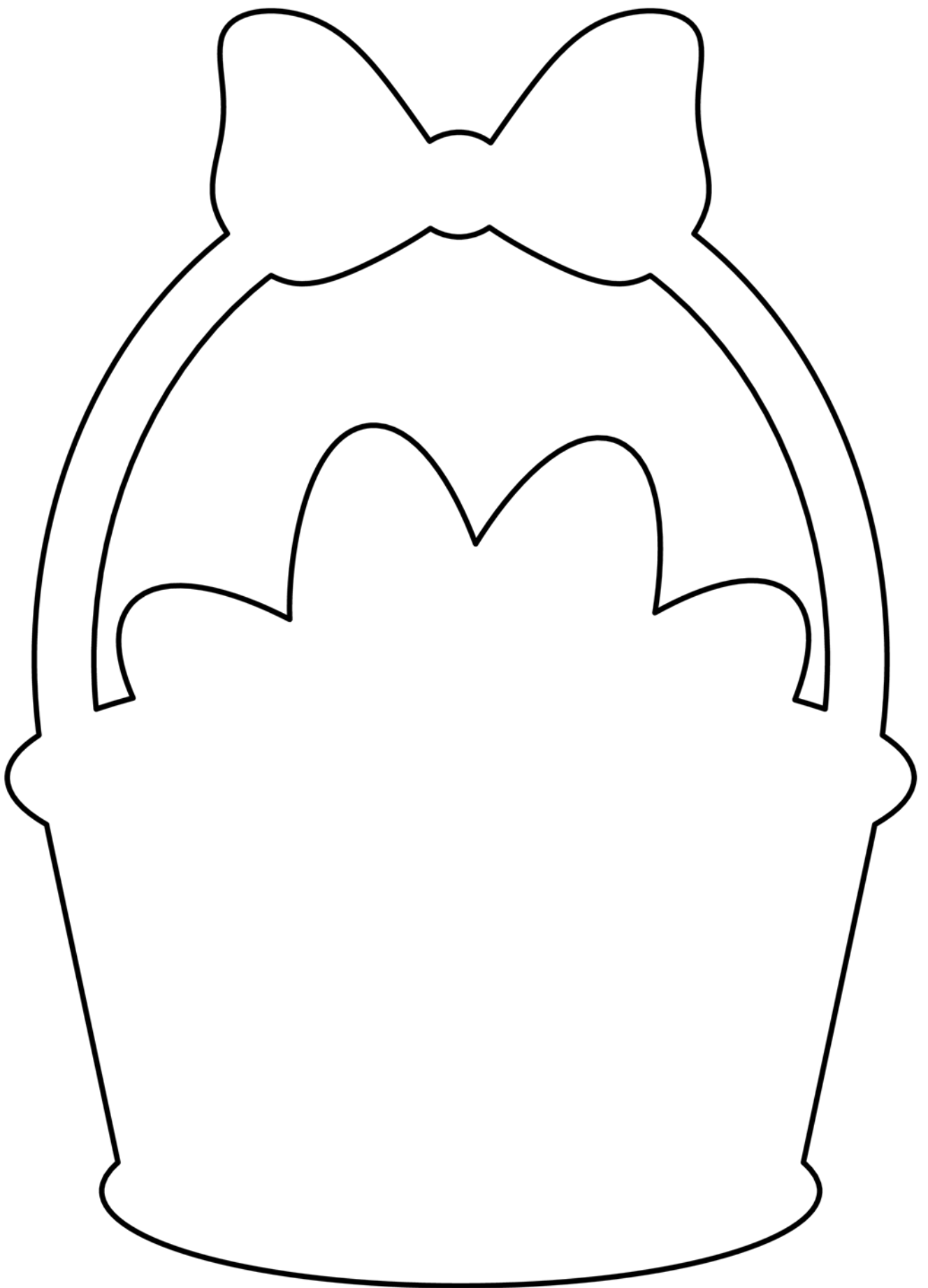

Easter Challenge: Flower Press Bookmarks



This activity is a really easy way to create your very own personalised bookmark.

Step 1: Collect a flower of your choice. This can be as big or small as you like but remember we're going to be making a bookmark with it! (Do be aware of where you're collecting your flower from, and remember not to take flowers from gardens unless you have permission)

You will need:

- A piece of card or paper
- A heavy book (or object)
- A strip of card (big enough for your chosen flower to fit)
- Glue

Step 2: Now you have your flower, you need to place this in between a few pieces of kitchen roll.

Step 3: You'll now need to place this within or under a heavy book (or another heavy object) and leave for 2-3 days until it has been squashed flat and is dry. If it's not quite ready, leave it a little longer.

Step 4: Once it's dry and flat, it's time to glue your pressed, dry flower to your strip of card.

Step 5: Now you can decide if you'd like to add more detail. Maybe drawing or colouring around your flower, add glitter or other craft items, or even just add your name. Why not make a small hole at one end and tie on threads of wool or coloured thread?



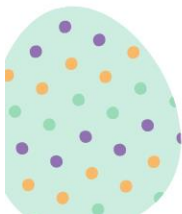

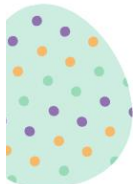




Easter Challenge: Food Friends



Here's a fun challenge to get you being creative with food! The only thing you will need to think about, is the colour of your breakfast, lunch or dinner. You may also need a little help from an adult for some parts of this activity!



You will need:

- Your breakfast, lunch, dinner or snack
- A knife
- Cocktail sticks or bamboo skewers (optional)



Step 1: Think about the food you're having and think of the animal you could make with your food - what shapes could you make? What colours will you have?



Step 2: You'll need to think about the different shapes you will need to make the different elements of your animal and whether this shape can be made by bending or shaping your food or whether it will need to be cut.



Step 3: Now you have your shapes assemble your animal by using your cocktail sticks, bamboo skewers or even just putting it together on your plate.



Step 4: Now you can enjoy your delicious lunch!

Step 5: Can you set yourself a challenge and try at least one new food each time?

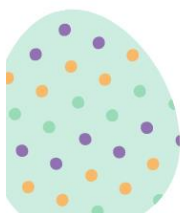


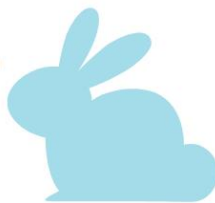
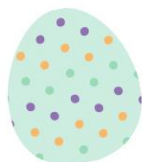

Easter Challenge: Grow your own Sunflower

Did you know, each sunflower is made up of thousands of teeny flowers. The iconic yellow petals and fuzzy brown centres are actually individual flowers themselves. As many as 2,000 can make up the classic sunflower bloom. You should harvest sunflowers in the morning, not the afternoon, if you're planning to clip a few to display in a vase.

You will need:

- Sunflower seeds
- Soil or compost
- A pot or patch of garden to plant your sunflower in
- A pen and paper to keep your sunflower growth diary

Each sunflower can contain as many as 1,000 to 2,000 seeds. So there are tons for birds to eat! But you can harvest and roast them for yourself, too. There are about 70 species of sunflowers. The tallest sunflower on record was over 9m tall, grown in Germany by Hans-Peter Schiffer. So here's a challenge to see how tall you can grow a sunflower!

Step 1: Plant your sunflower seed in approximately 3-5cms of soil (if you're planting more than one seed you'll need to plant them around 15cms apart).

Step 2: Water your seed/s once a week with plenty of water.

Step 3: Once your seed has started to spout, keep a diary of its growth and describe the changes you see.

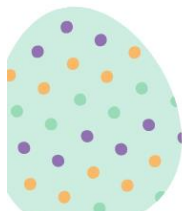
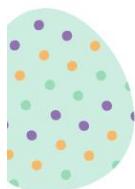
