Spring Term At Sitwell Infant School



#### In the Classroom!

We were busy in the Spring Term!

#### In Art each year group explored drawing!

F2 pupils were learning about mark making, exploring a variety of media including chalks and crayons which they used to create rubbings of natural objects. They used pencils to create observational drawings and self-portraits.

Year 1 pupils were learning how to create different types of lines and use techniques such as cross-hatching to represent different textures. They applied these techniques to produce observation drawings of objects.

Year 2 pupils explored using charcoal and were further developing their mark making techniques, such as stippling, to represent different textures. They went on to develop their understanding of how to apply expressions to illustrate their own cartoon characters.

### In Design and Technology each year group learned about Structures!

<u>F2 pupils</u> explored simple joining techniques to make their own junk box models.

<u>Year 1 pupils</u> were learning how to create stable structures and produced their own model windmills.

<u>Year 2 pupils</u> explored stability and methods to strengthen structures, to understand Baby Bear's chair weaknesses and develop an improved solution for him to use.

#### In Music:

KS1 pupils loved finding out about music technology, using the apps Launchpad and Blocswave on iPads to explore combining and layering sounds to create a mix. They went on to learn how to use stick and dot notation to compose and record simple rhythmic and pitch patterns.

F2 pupils explored percussion instruments and appraising music from different countries.
