Welcome Back!

Welcome back - I hope you have all had an enjoyable Easter break and found time to enjoy some peace and relaxation. As you will have noticed, the rules for Covid-19 have changed and testing kits are no longer freely available. From now on, any children who have a fever should not come to school until the fever has passed. This is the only symptom that we are advised to look out for.

Covid tests can be purchased if you are concerned about any other symptoms. Children who test positive should not come to school for 3 days. They can return to school after 3 days, provided that they do not have a fever. Other than this, children should be in school every day - they do not have to isolate if they are contacts of someone who has tested positive or if someone in the household has Covid.

Over the last two years, so much learning time has been missed and the school has plans to help the children catch-up. Extra tutors are working in school and catch-up interventions, such as the 'Rackets Cubed' lessons that Year 4 enjoyed on Tuesday, will be in place through the summer term. We ask that you support us with this by getting children into school on-time, every day.

School Refurbishment


Our school refurbishment work has continued over the Easter Holiday. Our site manager, Mr Singleton, has done an amazing job in organising the work on site and

The only classrooms which haven't been modernised are those used by Year 5 and 6 these are scheduled to be completed in the summer holiday.

During the summer holiday, the whole of the nursery playground will be remodelled and improved.
