#### Covid Guidance

The government and the Department for Education continue to update their Covid guidance which schools must follow. The key things that we all need to be aware of are:

- As of Tuesday 11th January, a PCR test is not needed to confirm a positive result from a Lateral Flow Test (LFT).
- If you test positive for Covid-19, then you only need to isolate for 7 days (instead of 10), providing you have 2 consecutive days of negative LFT results and you do not have a fever.
