Missing school means missing out . . .

As a parent or guardian, it is your responsibility to ensure that you get your child to school each day . . . on time!

It is also your responsibility to let the school know if they are going to be absent . . . and why.

- Illness (e.g. vomiting)
- Emergency appointment
- Exceptional circumstances

Our breakfast club is completely free! It runs every day from 7:45am until the start of the school day.


If children are struggling to get into school on time then why not come along to breakfast club?

Southcoates Attendance Ladder

How close is your child to reaching the top?



For every day your child is absent from school, over 6 hours of instructional time is lost.

Attendance Rewards

Every term, prizes and certificates are given out to all children who reach the target of 96%. Those children who have 100% receive an extra award.

Each week the class with the highest attendance gets cookies from the school kitchen and they get a star on the board in the main hall. Each class that earns five stars through the year gets to plan their own reward afternoon.

Did you know . . . ?

Government guidelines say that attendance should be at least 96%.

If attendance drops below 90%, your child is classed as a **persistent absentee** by the government and will be referred to the Education Welfare Service at Hull City Council, this can lead to prosecution.

Children who attend school every day make better progress and achieve more than those who miss time at school.

If your child's attendance is 90%, it is the same as missing:

- Half a day every week.
- 19 days across the school year
- A total of 133 days across their time at Southcoates!

Missing school means:

- Missing **LEARNING** . . . which leads to gaps in knowledge.
- Missing ACTIVITIES . . . which means missing out on fun.
- Missing TIME WITH FRIENDS . . . which means that they move on to new friends.

Term time holidays

Changes in the law mean that Principals can no longer authorise holidays in term time unless there are **exceptional** circumstances.

The following are **NOT** considered as exceptional:

- Lower costs
- Once in a lifetime experiences
- Holidays booked as a surprise by relatives

Children are only in school for 190 days per year, **PLEASE** take them on holiday on some of the other 175 days!

Fines

The Education Act of 1996 states that it is the responsibility of the parent or carer to ensure that all children between the ages of 5 and 16 attend school on a regular basis **and** on time.

Parents of children who have regular unauthorised absences or who take their children on holiday in term time may receive a penalty notice and a fine.

£60 per parent, per child!

Lateness

Arriving late can also cause problems:

- Children who arrive late disturb the lesson when they come in the room, which makes them feel uncomfortable and interrupts learning for others.
- It means that they miss important information at the start of lessons and it takes them longer to settle to work for the day.
- It means that if you are 15 minutes late each day you lose 9 ½ days of learning each school year!
