My Child at School - Notifications

All parents should now be receiving messages and emails through the My Child at School (MCAS) app. If you have not activated your MCAS account yet, please come and collect your letter from the school office as soon as possible. As previously explained, lunch and nursery payments are made through the app as well as updating contact details, so all parents need to activate their MCAS account.

Some parents have reported not realising that they have received messages on the MCAS therefore, we suggest that you go into your phone settings, find the MCAS app and allow notifications which should then show you whether you have messages requiring attention.

Before the Easter holidays, parents were notified that the 'Parental Consents' function on MCAS had been made active and they needed to re-do their child's consents. Parental Consents must be updated on the MCAS app to ensure they are up to date on our system regarding your child. These include consent for photographs to be taken in school, going out on local visits and other trips etc. If you have not already done so, please update the Parental Consents for your child/ children before we break up for half term.

Passport Requests

We have recently received some requests to countersign passports for children in school. Unfortunately the rules for this have changed and it is no longer something that we are able to do. The government now requires that this is now done by a friend or colleague who holds one of the listed professions.
