Covid-19 Guidance

Whilst the Covid-19 pandemic does appear to be getting better and there are optimistic signs of life starting to return to normal, I must remind you that the guidance for schools remains in place.

For children, the guidance from the DfE is anyone with symptoms should still take a test and these continue to be available. After a positive LFT or PCR, children should isolate for a minimum of 5 days and then continue to follow the guidance until they have received 2 negative test results on consecutive days.
