On the Wednesday, we went to the Museum of Archaeology. We learned about the past: the Stone Age, Bronze Age and Iron Age. Additionally, we learned about woolly mammoths. (They lived in Hull before the city had its name!) On the final day, we went on a trip to the University of Hull. We walked around campus and found out many interesting facts. Did you know, on the top floor of the library, you can see several famous landmarks (e.g. the Humber Bridge and Hull Royal)? Finally, we all did a presentation. (Earlier in the week we had started preparing our posters and acts, which we performed to parents/carers in our teams.) We had so much fun!
