Dear Parents and Carers,

Further Update: Hot Weather Warnings

The weather forecast continues to predict very hot weather for Wednesday, Thursday and now for Friday also. Our hot weather risk assessment remains in place. We are reviewing the use of spaces throughout the day and are supporting students to understand that some spaces are closed at certain times of the day.

Temperatures across the school have been very high. We will not be using the playground for our midday playtime while temperatures remain very high and have had to reduce the number of pupils who are able to use the Sports Hall at one time. Classrooms continue to be very warm, especially in Key Stage 5.

A reminder that a red alert means that there is an increased risk of dehydration, heat stress and heat exhaustion.

A reminder that pupils are encouraged to wear suitable clothing during this period of hot weather and do not have to wear school uniform this week. Pupils can wear shorts and t shirts. Shorts should be knee length.

If you feel your child is safer at home during this period of very warm weather, please do speak to a member of the leadership team. It is forecast to be a “real-feel” of over 40 degrees tomorrow with sustained temperatures on Thursday and Friday.
