# **Spa Bermondsey COVID 19 Risk Assessment and Contingency Plan April** 2022

During the COVID 19 pandemic, Spa Bermondsey is following advice issued by the DfE. Guidance is issued frequently and changes are made as required.

As of 1<sup>st</sup> April 2022, guidance has changed dramatically. Specific advice for all SEND settings and school settings has been withdrawn. *Living with COVID* has meant the withdrawal of free testing and the requirements to isolate have ended

Vaccines remain a key defence in staying well while *Living with COVID* and all staff and pupils are encouraged to have their vaccines. The school vaccine program has now ended, but pupils can still access the vaccine via their GP.

# Minimising transmission and risk of COVID outbreak

Good ventilation continues to be very important. Windows to be partially open to allow good ventilation in classrooms. KS3 classrooms to have their window vents open.

Classroom doors may be propped open as long as this will not be a distraction to pupils.

Staff may choose to wear face coverings while in the building including when teaching pupils

Staff should store their face covering safely and ensure it is changed when required.

Pupils may choose to wear face coverings. Those that do will need explicit teaching on safe usage of face coverings including handling, storage and disposal of coverings.

Independent travellers will also require explicit teaching of safe face covering usage if they are travelling on public transport. Pupils using public transport for a trip will require explicit instruction prior to the trip and this should in included in the trip risk assessment

All pupils are exempt from face covering mandates, however, pupils who are able to wear them safely and correctly can be encouraged to do so, especially when on public transport or school transport

Pupils and staff using the minibus will be encouraged to wear face coverings for the

duration of the trip. Windows to be opened to allow for ventilation. Passengers to not sit in the front row, to give the driver social distance.

## Pupil becoming unwell

Symptoms of COVID-19 can include:

- a high temperature or shivering (chills)
   a high temperature means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back (you do not need to measure your temperature)
- a new, continuous cough this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours
- a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste
- shortness of breath
- feeling tired or exhausted
- an aching body
- a headache
- a sore throat
- a blocked or runny nose
- loss of appetite
- diarrhoea
- feeling sick or being sick

The symptoms are very similar to symptoms of other illnesses, such as colds and flu.

If a child or young person aged 18 or under **tests positive** for COVID-19, they should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for **3 days.** This starts from the day after they did the test.

"Your child should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people if they have symptoms of COVID-19 and they either:

- have a high temperature
- do not feel well enough to go to school, college or childcare, or do their normal activities

They can go back to school, college or childcare when they feel better or do not have a high temperature."

If any pupil presents with a high temperature, their parent or carer will be called to collect them.

If a pupil presents with any of the other symptoms, their family will be called to discuss symptoms.

#### Staff member becomes unwell

Symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19) in adults can include:

- a high temperature or shivering (chills)
   a high temperature means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back (you do not need to measure your temperature)
- a new, continuous cough this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours
- a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste
- shortness of breath

Staff member to immediately inform Simon or Georgina

"Try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people if you have symptoms of COVID-19 and either:

- you have a high temperature
- you do not feel well enough to go to work or do your normal activities

Take extra care to avoid close contact with anyone who is at higher risk of getting seriously ill from COVID-19.

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Offer full time / part time spaces to those that require depending on staffing availability Bubble timetable to be re-introduced – classes may be consolidated depending in staffing availability

Inform social care/early help of those vulnerable pupils who have been offered a space, but who are not attending – if they have a social worker Consider workforce rota if required (as per March 2020)

Maths, English and Target work to be sent home weekly

Weekly phone call from Class tutor to discuss progress with parent / pupil (as applicable) Subject leads to publish weekly links to high quality resources and to make available resources to be downloaded or sent to families Reading and SoCo Life lessons to be reestablished on Teams / recorded sessions to be sent to families

Twice weekly calls to any pupil on vulnerable list not attending
