

MATHS: Earth & Planets

Pupils will develop their understanding of calculations and the four operations, as well as 2D and 3D shapes and data collection. Pupils will also utilise and apply their maths skills (based on individual next steps) through topic-based problems related to the world and planets.

ENGLISH: Exploring London

Pupils will learn to construct sentences using conjunctions, adjectives, and spell common words correctly. They will also learn to write reports, poems, and invitations. Others will learn to recognise pictures and words of famous London landmarks, use single words to describe them, and create simple sentences to describe familiar landmarks.

SOCIAL COMMUNICATION: Making people feel welcome and body language

Pupils will learn how to make others feel welcome in different settings by using body language, tone, and facial expressions. They will practise greeting others, starting short social interactions, and recognising how actions can include or exclude people. They will also learn about personal space and body language to help build positive relationships.

PSHE: People Who Can Help Me / Keeping Safe Online

Pupils will learn to recognise and avoid online fraud, stay safe online, and develop strategies to protect themselves. They will identify trusted adults and understand how these adults can help. They will also learn what information is safe to share and what should only be shared with trusted adults.

SCIENCE: Light

Pupils will learn to identify light sources, colours, and reflections, understand that light travels in straight lines, and distinguish between man-made and natural sources. They will identify the seven colours of the spectrum and comment on the outcomes of their actions. Some will recognise dangers and draw conclusions from investigations.

HUMANITIES: Places of Worship

Pupils will study various religious worship places, understand their significance, rituals, symbols, and objects. They will learn key beliefs, values, and traditions, fostering respect and tolerance for diverse perspectives in line with British Values. They will reflect on how religious communities express faith and relate this to their own lives.

MUSIC: Ukulele

Pupils will learn to use the correct technique for up and down strums, identify open strings and strumming patterns, and use their fingers to play block chords and perform.

DRAMA: Introduction to Puppetry

Pupils will explore using different puppets and ways to express emotions. They will experiment with various puppetry styles and communicate feelings through movement and voice. Additionally, they will improvise with puppets to clearly convey emotions or dialogue using hand movements or voice.

COMPUTING: Online security and new technology

Pupils will learn about and demonstrate an awareness and understanding of online safety in relation to passwords. They will also learn about smartphone technology.

COOKING: Knife Skills 3

Pupils will recognise, name, and use the utensils needed for peeling, snipping, and grating. They will develop their skills to confidently and independently peel, snip, and grate a variety of ingredients, applying these skills appropriately in food preparation tasks.

PE: Games

Pupils are introduced to the skills needed to play team games. They will develop a sense of fair play and feel a sense of achievement when they do their best to reach a goal. They will learn basic skills and movement patterns related to physical activities and games and learn to play by rules and apply strategy.

ART: Portraits & People

Pupils will develop their understanding of painting and drawing techniques. Their skills will show some refinement, and they will make considered decisions about which skills to use for specific tasks. Some pupils will discuss their work and that of others using art-specific vocabulary.
