Dear Parent/Guardian,

Your child's flu vaccination is now due. The vaccination is for pupil's up to the age of 17 years and 9 months. It is a quick, simple and painless spray up the nose. It is NOT an injection.

The flu vaccination is recommended to help protect against flu. Flu can be an unpleasant illness and can cause serious complications. Vaccinating your child will also help protect more vulnerable family and friends by preventing the spread of flu.

Even if your child had the vaccine last year, the type of flu can vary each winter, so it is recommended to have it again this year or they won't be protected.

The healthcare team and school will follow guidelines to ensure children are safe when being offered the vaccine.
