Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome back to the start of the summer term. We are pleased everyone has been safe and well over the break.

COVID update Our new Risk Assessment can be found on our website. Twice weekly testing for staff and pupils is no longer required and access to free tests has changed.

Possible symptoms of COVID 19, flu and common respiratory illnesses have been updated to include the following:

- continuous cough
- high temperature, fever or chills
- loss of, or change in, your normal sense of taste or smell
- shortness of breath
- unexplained tiredness, lack of energy
- muscle aches or pains that are not due to exercise
- not wanting to eat or not feeling hungry
- headache that is unusual or longer lasting than usual
- sore throat, stuffy or runny nose
- diarrhoea, feeling sick or being sick

Pupils should stay home if they have a fever or are unwell. As always do call the office if you are not sure about anything.

Punctuality Please make sure your son or daughter arrives at school on time. KS3 pupils should be in the playground ready to be collected by the class teams by 9.00. Primary pupils are collected by staff from 9.25. Registration and morning routines take place for the first 15 minutes of each day with lesson 1 starting promptly. Pupils who are regularly late are missing their learning so do please continue to get here on time.

Mobile Phones Please don't use your phones inside the playgrounds if you can help it. We are teaching pupils to manage screen time and appreciate your support with this.

Summer Term We have lots planned for the summer term. The Owl Display is returning in May. Families from each Key Stage will be invited to join us for afternoon tea on the green in June. Look out for your invitation. Our Dance Showcase will take place before half term and Sports Day and our Camberwell Carnival will be after half term. Sports Day will be in July and we will celebrate the end of term with the Spa Camberwell Carnival.
