Kings, Queens and Princesses

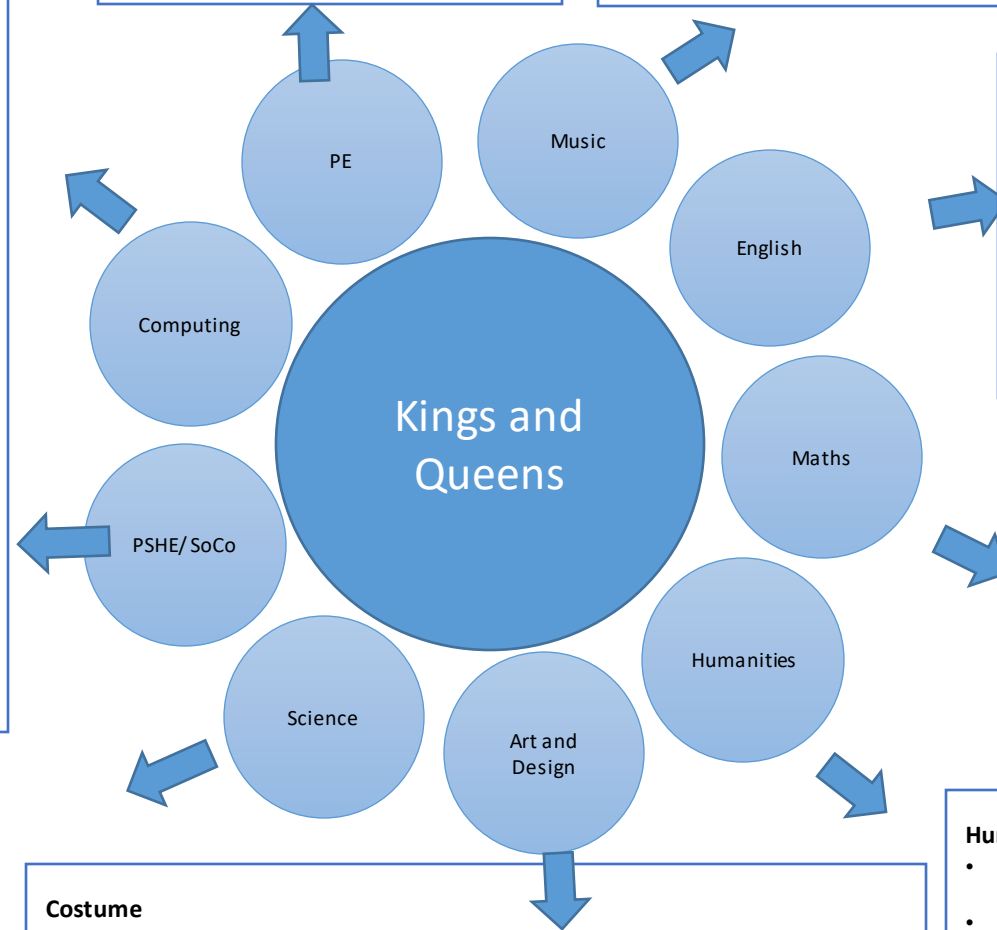
- Musical terminology
