## Maths ideas

Partition 2d numbers: how many different ways can you partition eg: 36 (30 + 6, 20 + 16, 10 + 26, 0 + 36)Use felt tips, chalk outside, paint, collage, anything!

Money – can you make different amounts? How many ways can you make 20p? 50p? What is the least amount of coins you can make 35p / £1.40? Make up your own totals.

Play games - dominoes, cards, monopoly, snakes and ladders etc...

Count forwards and backwards in steps of 2,5 and 10's

(Year 2's, times tables - try to begin to learn your 3 times)

Rapid recall of number bonds to 10/20 and associated facts.

Time – practise reading time to o'clock, half past, quarter past / to and to 5 minutes intervals.

Learn the days of the week and months of the year/seasons. Try to know them in their chronological order and any significant dates in our calendar. Can they work out what the fourth month is?

Compare lengths, heights, weights and capacities of objects using the language longer, shorter, taller, heavier, lighter, more, less, full, empty, half full etc... (try to do it in a fun way – baking, craft activities)

Estimating amounts of objects.

Finding one more and one less of objects to 20.

Look for 2D & 3D shapes in the environment.

## Literacy ideas.

Keep practising reading and spelling both Y1 and Y2 common exception words and spellings of Phase 3/4/5 and 6 phonics.

Practise writing sentences using a variety of sentences, different sentence openers with clear finger spaces, capital letters and full stops. (and any other appropriate punctuation eg: commas in lists, apostrophes for possession and contraction learnt in school)

Practise letter formation for lowercase and uppercase letters.
