Parking

Coronavirus Update

From the 1st April, all government guidance relating to actions for schools to take during the coronavirus pandemic has been withdrawn. We will continue to monitor the situation within school in order to keep our children safe.

General guidance on what to do if your child is unwell is still available. Please see below -

Children and young people with mild symptoms such as a runny nose, sore throat, or slight cough, who are otherwise well, can continue to attend their education setting.

Children and young people who are unwell and have a high temperature should stay at home and avoid contact with other people, where they can. They can go back to school, college or childcare, and resume normal activities when they no longer have a high temperature and they are well enough to attend.

All children and young people with respiratory symptoms should be encouraged to cover their mouth and nose with a disposable tissue when coughing and/or sneezing and to wash their hands after using or disposing of tissues.

It can be difficult to know when to seek help if your child is unwell. If you are worried about your child, especially if they are aged under 2 years old, then you should seek medical help.

Bungalow

Safe families is a national charity whose aim is to support vulnerable families in the local community. Their local team will be using our bungalow as their North East Lincolnshire office and we welcome them and the valuable work that they do.
