Project Title: Inuit

Project and exhibition: Art exhibition and workshop



Project Synopsis:

Our project is art based. We will be studying Inuit artists and art.

- We will learn about the land use and natural resources of the Arctic region.

Curriculum opportunities:

Writing

Reading

Maths

We will be looking at area in connection with land use.

Music

We will be exploring shape as part of our artwork – manipulating designs by reflecting and rotating (symmetry) scaling and tessellating.

RE

We will be looking at Hinduism and discovering which countries have the largest and smallest amount of practicing Hindus.

Computing

We will be developing our coding skills by solving problems by de-constructing codes.

Safeguarding

We will be thinking about how to look after ourselves and considering how to keep our minds and bodies healthy (diet, drugs, alcohol, managing stress)
