Sport Premium Funding Expenditure Report 2019-2020

What is the Sports Premium Grant?

The Sports Premium Grant is additional funding from the Government to improve the provision of physical education and sport in primary schools. It is also to be used for improving the health and wellbeing of primary pupils.

How much is the Sports Premium Grant?

Allocations for the academic year 2019-2020 are calculated using the number of pupils in Years 1 to 6 and those age 5 in Reception, as recorded in the January 2019 census. Each school has also been funded extra through the government's sugar tax increasing the total to £18,770.

How is the Sports Premium Grant being spent?

Springfield Primary Academy provides a fantastic sports programme through our high quality curriculum, festivals for all and sporting competitions for the gifted and talented pupils. This year all teaching staff have received high quality CPD on a half termly basis working alongside specialist PE coaches from Pivotal Skills. All children from Year 1 onwards have experienced a wide variety of games, gym, athletics and dance curriculum and also have had the opportunity to take part in one focused sports festival during the year through our Sports 4 All alliance with local primary schools. These focus sports have included tag rugby, basketball, indoor athletics, multi-skills and rounders. We have continued to encourage more children to take part in our out of school activity programmes adding new sports this year; hockey, netball, circuit training and cross country. We are also committed to children being active at break times and lunchtimes following the C4L guidelines. The Academy has employed a member of staff from Pivotal Skills to run an active 30 club each lunchtime which is rotated between the KS2 classes as well as trained 15 year five children who help to support and provide additional activities for both all children throughout the school.
