Science:



Focus on animals including humans

To identify and name a variety of common animals.

To identify carnivores, herbivores and omnivores.

To describe and compare the structure of common animals.

To identify the parts of the body associated with each sense.

(Y1) Time

To compare events.

To tell the time to the hour and half past.


Place Value

To count forwards and backwards within 100.

To partition 2-digit numbers.

To order 2-digit numbers.

To compare 2-digit numbers.



(Y2) Time

To tell the time to the hour, half past, quarter past and quarter to. To begin to tell the time in 5 minute increments.

Position, direction and movement

To describe position, direction and movement.

Measures

To measure, compare and order length, mass and capacity.

To recognise cycles of life in nature (including humans).

To know that there are some changes that are outside my control and discuss how I feel about them.

To recognise the physical differences between boys and girls, use the correct names for parts of the body and appreciate that some parts of my body are private.
