

Year 3 and 4

Please encourage your child to log on to their Bug Club and Times Tables Rock Stars accounts daily. On Bug Club there will be reading and grammar games for the children to complete. As they read the books online, remind them to click on the bug icon to complete the questions. What they complete on these websites will feed back to their class teacher.

A copy of their current CLIC and SAFE challenge has been sent home for them to practise. You can support them with this by looking at errors together and giving them similar questions with different numbers. Each week, they can log on to their Big Maths account to complete their weekly challenge. Again, this data will feed back to their class teacher.

There are many websites and apps the children can use to practise their maths skills. We have recently been doing time and time tables in maths and the following games would help consolidate this.

So any practise your child can do in these areas will support them greatly. Your child should continue to read their school book or own book daily. Once completed, they could complete one of the following activities linked to the book:

- Write a book review
- Draw a scene from the book
- Draw a character from the book
- Write a blurb for the book
- Draw a story mountain for the book showing key events

Don't forget to complete activities from the reading challenge.

Please encourage your child to practise words they find tricky from the Year 3/4 spelling list.

Our topic this term has been art based linked to our Misty Mountain, Winding Rivers topic from last half term. Please continue to complete activities from the homework menu. In science, we have been studying plants; your child could follow this up with their own research and could present their findings ready to share with the class when we return.
