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<u>leaching input</u>

- Ask children if they have been in a plane before and give them opportunities to discuss what they saw out of the window.
- Explain to children cities can be viewed from above as if you are a bird flying over them. This is called an aerial view.
- Discuss with children that you can see physical and human features from aerial views but they look different.
- Look at the aerial views of cities on the slides and ask children what features they can see and how they look.
- Explain to children that aerial views can be represented as a map, using symbols and patterns.
- Show children some maps with symbols and discuss the shapes and patterns.

Main Activity

Lower ability:

Adult support is needed here. and City Map. Children are to find small objects. They need to colour the words and symbols on the worksheet so they match. They then find the feature on the city map and cover it with the same coloured counter.

Middle ability:

Provide children with worksheet the map as it is missing. They need their own city map including both eight different coloured counters or to create their own symbols for the given pictures and name the features. There are three extra symbols at the bottom of the page they need to have a think about.

Higher ability:

Provide children with worksheet 5C Provide children with worksheet 5A 5B. Children are to create a key for and the Key. Children are to design physical and human features. They need to fill in the key with symbols. They then need to add extra features to their map and record them on the key page. They need to draw simple symbols not detailed symbols.

Fancy something different...?

- Children are going to be tourists today of a make-believe city.
- Ask children to get into small groups or with partners. This activity could also be done independently.
- Provide children with Simon's City Map, Simon's City Tourist Cards and Travel Journal.
- Children read the statements on Simon's City Tourist Cards. They need complete the action asked of them and record in the travel journal what they see. Children need to draw a symbol for the feature and write a short sentence about it.
- Remind children to be creative when describing the feature.

<u>Plenary</u>	Assessment Questions
Show children the last slide in the presentation. Ask children to discuss with a partner what symbols or patterns they could draw for the four features.	 Can children explain what an aerial map is? Can children use symbols and keys to create a map? Can children recognise human and physical features on maps?
