Covid-19 Update

Parents do not need reminding about the recent rise in infections both nationally and locally. With Birmingham now on the National watch list and having the third highest case rate in England, we face some challenging weeks ahead. To reassure parents, the school is following all the guidelines https://www.gov.uk/government/publications/actions-for-schools-during-the-coronavirus-outbreak/guidance-for-full-opening-schools including sending pupils home who display symptoms e.g. temperatures. A couple of reminders to help keep our school community safe:

- Please do not drop young children outside the school gate before ensuring that they have entered the premises
- Please do not congregate immediately outside the main gate, thus blocking access for other children and parents
- Please say goodbye to KS2 pupils outside the school gate, thus leaving clear access for all other pupils

School Food

School Meals - As per letter issued on Wednesday, we are making changes to lunchtime arrangement for next week.

Children will eat a cold lunch in the hall in their year group 'Bubbles,' as opposed to their classrooms. This change will allow any issues to be ironed out before hot lunches resume the following week (21st Sept)

Toast (Y3-Y6) - An email was sent out informing parents of the arrangements for ordering toast using our cashless system https://eduspot.co.uk/. This service will be up and running for next week

Fruit – If any KS2 child wishes to bring into school a piece of fruit for break time they may do so (KS1 given fruit under government's 'Free Fruit Scheme').

School Fund and School Building Maintenance Fund

We ask our families for a voluntary £5.00 (per family) per year contribution towards school fund. This year this money was used to purchase a range of resources, to enhance learning and the school environment. In addition to school fund, we ask our families to contribute a small voluntary donation (£5.00 per family) towards our school maintenance building fund.
