

COVID-19

As you are aware, there have been some recent announcements from the Government regarding the Step 4 Road map and schools. We are currently in the process of working through government guidelines and plans for September, being mindful that currently rates in Moseley have increased significantly to 356 per 100,000 and 371 in Birmingham as a whole.

Our aim is to get things as back to relative normal and as soon as we possibly can e.g. start/finish times, mixing 'Bubbles', timetables etc. We are mindful, however, that some measures may have to stay in place. We will also be working with public health should there be cases or an outbreak in school.

We are very keen to reinstate some of the things we have been unable to do over the last year or so. We recognise that it will be a period of adjustment for our children and us all, as we move to a 'new normal'. We will keep you fully informed about return to school arrangements. Please ensure that you read emails prior to this on 2nd and 3rd Sept before children return on 6th Sept.

Recent information has indicated that <u>Covid symptoms for many children include a runny nose, sore throat, cough</u> <u>and 'cold like' symptoms.</u> If your child has any of these symptom at this time when the variant is spreading so rapidly, please take your child for a PCR test <u>at https://www.gov.uk/get-coronavirus-test</u>

FSM Vouchers

FSM vouchers will be issued over the summer holidays for 4 weeks. This voucher scheme will be funded through the government's COVID Local Support Grant. For Reception to Year 6 each voucher code is worth £60. You need to look out for an email with regards to redeeming your voucher, which will be emailed out the week of the 12th July. Please contact the school office if your email has changed.


Year 6 Leavers
