# Covid-19 Update

#### Track and Trace – Positive Cases until 23rd December

The DfE has announced that schools, rather than Public Health England, are required to be on call until 23rd December to manage Track and Trace for each school.

- If your child has COVID symptoms you need to book a COVID test for the child and inform school of the results up until 23<sup>rd</sup> December
- While you are waiting for test results your family MUST self-isolate completely
- Please email results to enquiry@stjonmon.bham.sch.uk to allow us to start the process of informing contacts
- All parents must make sure they check text alerts and emails from school, which may alert you that your child has been a contact with a positive case and must self-isolate

# Free School Meal Children - Vouchers

If you receive Free School Meals please check your emails (including Junk) as vouchers from Edenred to cover the cost of lunches during school closure over the Christmas period have been sent out. Please remember that one voucher is issued per family and the value of that voucher varies depending on the number of children that you have. This amount is to make provision for children over the two-week period that school is closed.

# When the children return on 5th January can we remind parents again of the following:

- To inform school via email you are exempt from wearing a mask (so that staff are aware and do not keep asking you)
- <u>To stand aside from the main school gates, not blocking them, to allow children from each class</u> 'Bubble' to enter the school premises safely.
- To arrive as near to the set class time as possible, to avoid congestion on both the road and pavement outside school
- To be courteous and step to the side on the pavement outside school if you are waiting, to give children and families to space to pass
- Adhere to the following staggered times:

8.45am – 2.55pm – Year 2 & Year 6

8.55am - 3.05pm - Year 1 & Year 5

9.05am - 3.15pm - Year 3 & Year 4 9.15am - 2-45pm - Reception

#### **Parents Code of Conduct**

This term, we have had to spend time dealing with several incidents regarding parents code of conduct. This has taken staff and senior leadership away from the vital day-to-day work of teaching and learning and moving our school forward. Recent incidents have involved parents reprimanding other parent's children outside the school gates and parents having disagreements outside school and bringing parental issues into school via their children. This is not acceptable and goes against our parent's code of conduct.

- If a parent has a concern about an incident that has taken place <u>in school hours</u>, then they must speak to the class teacher in the first instance for the incident to be investigated and dealt with. Parents should not take it upon themselves to either confront another parent or reprimand their child outside school.
- Any personal disagreements between parents should be resolved outside school. Staff and leadership
  cannot be responsible for resolving any ongoing disagreements between parents. Neither should they be
  expected to mediate between parents while such issues are ongoing. Parents also need to be mindful about
  the effect this has on children coming to school.

We are all here to work together for the best outcomes for our children. Thank you for your support and understanding in this matter.

Well done to Zachary Y2 and Areeba Y3 for regularly accessing Reading Eggs/Express and working hard through the programme!


#### **Mathletics**
