
Parent Consultations

We are so blessed that our school is set in such a wonderful environmental setting and we are a continually trying hard to maintain our school grounds and keep them beautiful!



Littering

I have noticed since the children have returned to school, so has littering in our school grounds. We have purchased several new bins which are located around our school. Please encourage your children to use these after school if they are disposing of litter. Thank you.

Keeping to Paths around School

We ask parents to encourage their children to stick to our school paths. The grass at the front of the school is being steadily eroded away due to people waking on it. This is making the soil muddy and the grassy areas unsightly (including the area around the large tree). By keeping to the paths, it will give the grass time to grow back, thus improving our school environment.

Birmingham Clean Air Zone

From June 2021 a 'Clean Air Zone' is being introduced in Birmingham City Centre to improve air quality, in particular by discouraging the most polluting vehicles from entering the zone. No vehicle is banned in the zone, but those which do not have clean enough engines will have to pay a daily charge if they travel within the area. This will improve the air quality for our children and families. The attached power point provides a clearer idea of the city councils 'Clean Air Zone' strategy, which I would encourage you to read.

Cars Idling

I am sorry to say that I have had complaints again form local residents regarding car engines left idling while parents wait to collect their children. Recent research showed that some 27% of parents and guardians leave engines running outside schools despite car emissions being known to increase the risk of health issues. Vehicle emissions are closely linked to respiratory and other health issues and can carry fines of up to £80. We ask all our parents to turn engines off while their cars are stationary. Thank you.

Illegal Parking

Unfortunately, our local school residents are still having problems with parents parking illegally across their driveways when dropping/collecting children to/from school. We have reminded parents before about parking respectfully around our school and do so again. Advice to residents is to take the vehicle registrations and a photo report it to the police. I have also been in touch with the police to request more regular patrols outside school to prevent this from happening. Thank you to vast majority of our school community who are considerate and park respectfully.



Uniform

Thank you to all those parents who are trying very hard to send their children into school in full school uniform – we know how difficult it has been to source uniform and school shoes. For health and safety purposes, please make sure that footwear is sensible and safe. Please also make sure that children come into school in PE kit on the correct day. Finally, all those pupils with hair longer than shoulder length, should have it tied back. This is for health reasons and to prevent hair getting in eyes during lessons and PE. Thank you for your co-operation in this matter.

We recognise that there have been some recent roadworks and accidents, but ask that children are dropped and collected on time.

Attendance

Thank you for those parents who are making sure that their child/ren are in school every day. We have had a number of families, who for one reason or another, are visiting family abroad. Whilst there may be the occasional exceptional circumstance, visits abroad should **NOT** be booked in school time and will be classed as unauthorised. Holidays, plus quarantine afterwards, means that children miss so much education, it can be very difficult to catch up when they return.
