Covid-19

Track and Trace – Positive Cases until Tuesday 6th April.

School will manage Track and Trace until 6th April. For this reason, if your child tests positive for COVID-19 you **MUST** inform school of the results up until Wednesday 7th April. Please email results to <u>enquiry@stjonmon.bham.sch.uk</u> to allow us to start the process of informing contacts. All parents must make sure they check text alerts and emails from school, which may alert you that your child has been a contact with a positive case and must self-isolate.



Lateral flow device – home testing kits

The Government announced that, if you are a member of a household, childcare bubble or support bubble of a primary aged child, you can get a twice weekly test kit to test yourself at home. As with teachers, this will identify asymptomatic cases and reduce transmission rates. The twice-weekly test kits can be obtained:

- > Through your employer if they offer testing to employees contact your employer to find out.
- By collecting a home test kit from a test site. You can collect two packs of home test kits at a local collection point. Each pack contains seven tests. Anyone 18 or over can collect. You can check online if the location is busy before you go. Find your nearest home test kit collection point here: <u>https://maps.test-and-trace.nhs.uk/</u>
- If you cannot get tested at your workplace, or are unable to go to a test site or collect test kits, you can order a home test kit online.
- Do not order online if you can get a test through other methods. This frees up home delivery for those who need it most. Order rapid lateral flow home test kits here: <u>https://www.gov.uk/guidance/rapid-lateral-flow-testing-for-households-and-bubbles-of-school-pupils-and-staff</u>

You must be in receipt of your formal notification email before contacting the council.
