## **COVID-19 Update**

As seen across the country and in local areas recently, unfortunately, we are seeing a rise in COVID cases. Whilst the majority of pupils will not become too ill with COVID, we need to try and halt the transmission across our community to protect all of our pupils, staff and families.

If your child develops symptoms of COVID-19 (new, continuous cough, high temperature, loss/change in taste/smell), they should remain at home for at least 10 days from the date when their symptoms appeared. Anyone with symptoms will be eligible for testing and this can be arranged via

We are extremely mindful of the negative impact of missing education has on children and young people, therefore, restricting attendance at school will only be considered as an absolute last resort. The school remains open and providing your child remains well they must continue to attend school as normal.


