#### Covid-19 Update

Thank you to parents for keeping us fully informed about children/household members who are experiencing symptoms or who have tested positive. We have been working effectively in partnership with parents to keep our school community safe. We are thankful that we have had no positive cases in school for four weeks. We pray that this continues. Thank you again for your support and co-operation.

#### Self-Isolation

A reminder that children should <u>NOT</u> come to school under the following circumstances:

- If a parent/sibling/household member has coronavirus symptoms
- If a parent/sibling/household member does or does not have symptoms (asymptotic), but is waiting for a test result

If a parent/sibling/household member has coronavirus symptoms (and has had a test or not), all members of the household should self-isolate for 14 days from the day the symptoms first became apparent or from the date of the test results (if asymptomatic). If you can have dates at hand when symptoms were first identified that will be most helpful.

Important: We are concerned that a couple of children have disclosed that they have mixed with other households/families at a celebration/party the weekend. As Birmingham is currently under Tier 2 Lockdown restrictions, with no households mixing indoors, if this is the case, children will be required to self-isolate for 14 days as a preventative measure.



The Infants or KS1 children were taught in a school next to our parish church St John and Martin's. The Infant school was called St John's and was opened in 1911 with 214 pupils. In 1980 the two schools amalgamated to become SS John and Monica's. We are proud that our school has a long standing history in our community.
