Please Note:

Unfortunately, we are not in the position to make separate arrangements for siblings who are scheduled to arrive at different times. Siblings will be able to enter the school site when parents are dropping off another child, but will not be allowed to enter the school building until it is their allocated time to do so. Equally parents will not be able to collect siblings together if their time allocations are different. We recognise the inconvenience of this and can only apologise, but we are having to follow strict government guidelines. If you are having to wait in between to drop off siblings, we suggest that you either go for a short walk, sit in your car or wait in the vicinity (but not near) the school entrance.

Personal Possessions

- Year 6 parents/carers should have received an email regarding the collection of personal possessions. There will be an opportunity for parents to collect these and some exercise books between the hours of 10.00am-2.00pm on Monday 13th July. (Please note that this will be the only day that these will be available.). Possessions will be in named bags and available from the front of the school. Please remember to return all reading books so that these can be passed on to next year's pupils.
- Unfortunately, due to our current health and safety restrictions regarding visitors to school, we are unable to facilitate parents collecting children's personal belongings including P.E kit from any other year band. Please do not worry, these will be kept safety until September, at which point they can be taken home to be washed. The P.E curriculum will not start until week 2.

You should have received an email regarding reading books and diaries which were sent home before school closure. Please, keep these safe over the summer holidays and return them to school in September. If not, our school will be very short of reading scheme books to give out in September.
