Key Vocabulary- What words do I need to know and understand?

Physical Features	Physical geography is the study of Earth's natural features. Features like seas, mountains and rivers, that are natural.
Human Features	Human characteristics include the size and density of the population, the ethnic and religious makeup of the population, language and changes that humans have created.
Rural	A rural area is an open piece of land that has few homes or other buildings, and not very many people. A rural area's population density is very low.
Urbanisation	Urbanisation is the process through which cities grow, and higher and higher percentages of the population comes to live in the city.
Climate	Weather describes the condition of the atmosphere. It might be sunny, hot, windy or cloudy, raining or snowing. Climate means the average weather conditions.
Push and Pull factors	Push factors "push" people away from their home and include things like war. Pull factors "pull" people to a new home and include things like better opportunities.
