 their oracy skills and skills such as teamwork, problem-solving, and
 critical thinking. Such skills are vital for success in further education and
 employment.
- Career Awareness: Early exposure to different industries and career paths broadens pupils' horizons and helps them make informed choices about their future.
- Enhanced Learning Experiences: Businesses can offer unique learning opportunities like workplace visits, mentoring programs, and hands-on projects, enriching the curriculum and making learning more interactive. We have also invited companies to be our 'judges' or audience when showcasing something we have learnt in school.

Benefits for school:

- Stronger Community Links: Partnerships with businesses and industries, including local businesses, strengthen school-community relationships, fostering a sense of collaboration and shared responsibility for pupil success. We think it is important for our school to be active within our Mill Hill community

Statement of Expectations for [Company Name] Partnership with St. Aidan's CE Primary Academy.

Expectations for [Company Name]:

Visits to School:

- o Commit to a minimum of 2 visits per academic year.
- Collaborate with teachers to plan engaging activities aligned with the curriculum; one being an introductory session to your company and what jobs people do there and why.
- o Offer opportunities for pupils to ask questions and interact with company representatives.
- Consider providing resources or materials to support classroom learning.

Workplace Visits (Where Possible):

 Be open to hosting small groups of pupils for workplace visits, allowing them to experience a real work environment.

What we will do:

Communication and Coordination:

- Maintain open communication with [Company Name] regarding curriculum themes, invites into school and potential visit dates.
- o Provide necessary information about the pupils and any specific learning needs
- Always support in class- sessions can also be co planned.
- Ensure a welcoming and organised environment for company representatives during school visits.

Workplace Visits (Where Possible):
