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Head lice

Please can we ask that children with long hair try and keep it tied up tight, either in a ponytail or plait to try and prevent Head lice.

Nut Free

Just to remind all parents/carers - we are a **NUT FREE** school. We do have some children in school with severe nut allergies. Please do not send any type of nut product into school with your child, for example-Nutella, Kinder Bueno. If you are unsure please always check the packaging. Thank you for your understanding and support.




