<u>Attendance</u>

It is the parent/carers legal responsibility to make sure your child attends school. Each year we set a target for attendance and this is used to compare us to other schools nationally. Our current **target is 95%** attendance.

What YOU must do:

- Try to telephone the school before 8.30am each day of your child's absence.
- Tell the school in advance, of any medical appointments and bring in appointment cards/letters.
- If your child is ill, read the NHS advice, <u>https://www.nhs.uk/mental-health/</u> to help you decide whether they can go to school.
- If you are not sure whether your child is well enough to attend school, send them in anyway as they often perk up on arrival.
- Have a backup plan for if your child misses transport, call on a family member, neighbour or friend.
- If you and your child are experiencing difficulties with school attendance then talk to us as a first step so we can help!

What WE will do:

- Check your child's attendance every day.
- Phone home to discuss your child's attendance with you.
- Invite you into school for attendance meetings if we are concerned.
- If we cannot establish a reason for absence, then we may make a welfare home visit.

World Book Day and our Vocabulary Parade

Words-be excited about words, celebrate new words and be curious to find out the meaning of unknown words. Learning words is really important; the more words your child knows, the more it will help them at school and in life.

Next Thursday we will become vocab detectives, read books about vocabulary and have a vocabulary parade.

Children need to choose a word and create a homemade costume. We will send home a sign for each child next week.

- *Plan*-think of an interesting word, something others may not know. Word lists have been provided for ideas.
- Create-recycle items from around your home to create your costume. Use boxes, hats, bags, fabric, tin foil etc.
- Design-card or label with your word on it. The word needs to stand out in the parade. Make a headband or hat, wear the word or carry it. It just needs to be visible somewhere on you.

Please do not go to any expense and come to school wearing your costume next Thursday.

Head lice



These cause much frustration amongst parents. Every school in the country has to constantly contend with this menace. To try and control the spread of head lice our policy is to contact parents of children who are seen to have head lice so that they can be collected, treated and returned to school. In most cases a child can return to school the same day. Please remember, if head lice are found then it is important to check every family member in the household and to check again a week later.

Please note that **we will authorise a maximum of half a day's absence for head lice to be treated**. Thank you for your support in this.
