Household Support Fund - Who Can Get Help?

You may be eligible if:

BLACKBURN

DARWEN

You are working and your household income is:

Less than £26,057 a year (before tax and National Insurance) if you're a single adult

DROP OFF WHAT YOU CAN

- Less than £38,870 a year (before tax and National Insurance) if you are two or more adults in work
- And your household savings are below £2,000

OR you receive income-based benefits and meet any of these conditio

- · You have a physical or learning disability, or Autism
- . You have a long-term health condition that is made worse by cold weather
- You rely on electrical equipment to live independently
- You have vulnerable adults or children in your home who are supported by mental health services, social workers, or family support
- · You are a carer
- You are a refugee or asylum seeker
- You have recently started or left a job and are waiting for benefits to start
- . Your Universal Credit payment is £0 due to a changeable or part-time income

You may also be able to apply online for more help from the Household Support Fund:

If you don't qualify for the Household Support Fund, there are other types of help available too. Please ask your school what support they offer.

Head lice

These cause much frustration amongst parents. Every school in the country has to constantly contend with this menace. To try and control the spread of head lice our policy is to contact parents of children who are seen to have head lice so that they can be collected, treated and returned to school. In most cases a child can return to school the same day.

Please remember, if head lice are found then it is important to check every family member in the household and to check again a week later.

Please note that we will authorise a maximum of half a day's absence for head lice to be treated. Thank you for your support in this.

2: TREAT
Use lice treatment product

3: REMOVE lice/nits by combing the hair with the comb provided.

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

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
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Christmas Pantomime 2025—Snow White
