Attendance-changes to Penalty Notices

You may be aware that the Department for Education has recently announced national changes to fixed penalty notices issued for unauthorised absence during term time.



These changes will come into effect on 19th August 2024.

The changes to be aware of are:

- Penalty notices issued for offences that take place after 19th August 2024 will be charged at a new rate of £160 per parent per child. This can be paid at £80 if paid within 21 days.
- A second penalty notice issued to the same parent, for the same child, within a rolling 3year period will be issued at the rate of £160 to be paid within 28 days, with no option for a discounted rate.
- The threshold at which a penalty notice must be considered is set at 10 sessions (equivalent to 5 days) of unauthorised absence within a rolling 10-school week period. This may include absences as a result of arriving late after the register closes (after 9.30am). The 10 school weeks may span different terms or school years.
- A maximum of 2 penalty notices may be issued to a parent for the same child within a rolling 3year period, so at the 3rd (or subsequent) offence(s) another course of action will need to be considered (such as prosecution or one of the other attendance legal interventions)

Dinner money charges

Unfortunately due to rising costs we are having to increase our dinner prices from £2.41 to £2.70 per day, £13.50 per week. This is effective from Tuesday 3^{rd} September 2024.

On Monday we have the climbing wall coming to school. All children should come to school wearing their school t-shirt and jumper or cardigan with leggings, shorts or tracksuit bottoms.

Place2Be

Unfortunately, due to budget cuts and a lack of counsellors we will no longer be able to have Place2Be in school. We have worked with them to provide mental help support for many of our pupils and families for the last eight years. I would like to thank them for their help and support- they will be missed.

In September we are going to introduce Thrive. Which, for us, will be a way of implementing a whole school approach to mental health, involving, identifying and addressing the needs of pupils, staff and the wider community and creating an environment that removes barriers to learning in a more cost effective way. In line with Public Health England's 8 principles of a whole school approach, Thrive will provide expert training and an online tool that will empower us to not only promote mental health and wellbeing, but improve behaviour, attendance and attainment.

Prime VR Workshop

PrimeVR will be delivering a virtual reality workshop on Tuesday 2nd July to all KS2 pupils. The workshops have been specifically designed for schools to help bring learning to life. There is a charge of £2.00 per child which is payable via Schoolmoney. Online permission forms have been sent out separately.

There are still quite a few payments outstanding despite several reminders. Please can I reiterate that if payment has NOT been received for your child by Monday afternoon then they will unfortunately miss out on the VR workshop.

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Head lice



These cause much frustration amongst parents. Every school in the country has to constantly contend with this menace. To try and control the spread of head lice our policy is to contact parents of children who are seen to have head lice so that they can be collected, treated and returned to school. In most cases a child can return to school the same day.

Please remember, if head lice are found then it is important to check every family member in the household and to check again a week later.

Please note that we will authorise a maximum of half a day's absence for head lice to be treated. Thank you for your support in this.
