It was lovely to see some of our parents come in to school and join our Reception class for Rhyme time on Thursday. The children enjoyed what they had learnt

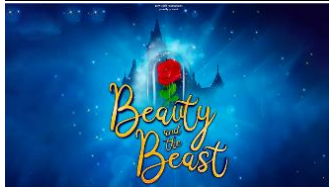
Outward Bound 2024

Keep Your Eye On The Ball

(Luke 12:39-48 Based on a social media post)

I know that many of you enjoy watching cricket or support Blackburn Rovers but I'm not sure how many have followed England's Rugby World Cup adventure. They went into the tournament as no hoppers. Their form going into the competition was poor and some even suggested that they'd be lucky to progress beyond the group stages. They actually made it to the semi-finals where they were complete underdogs to the holders, South Africa. England lost the match 16-15 but were in the lead up to 3 minutes before the end. Steve Borthwick, the head coach, commented, "We went into the match with a plan but we were unable to execute it up to the final whistle"! The team had prepared carefully but a combination of tiredness, substitutions and a change in South Africa's tactics meant that England fell short of reaching the final and their end goal. They hadn't prepared for all eventualities and they took their eye off the ball at the vital moment. In the Church's year we come to the end of the "Sundays after Trinity" and are entering into the four weeks before the start of Advent. Advent is all about being prepared for Jesus Christ and our Bible readings now are already concentrating on the theme of "Being ready". Because of carol concerts and school nativity plays our focus in Advent is often mainly on Jesus' first coming as a baby. It isn't as fashionable to focus on His second coming as Ruler and Judge. Yet, as Christians in the 21 st century this should be a clear area of focus. We celebrate and give thanks for His first coming but this has come and gone. Jesus doesn't want His followers, whenever they like, to get caught out by being distracted at the vital moment. After all no one but God knows when Jesus will return. Jesus gave specific teaching to the disciples about this because He knew how important it is. May we use these weeks before Christmas to take stock and readjust our focus as necessary so that we are prepared and ready for our Lord's return whenever this happens. Amen
