







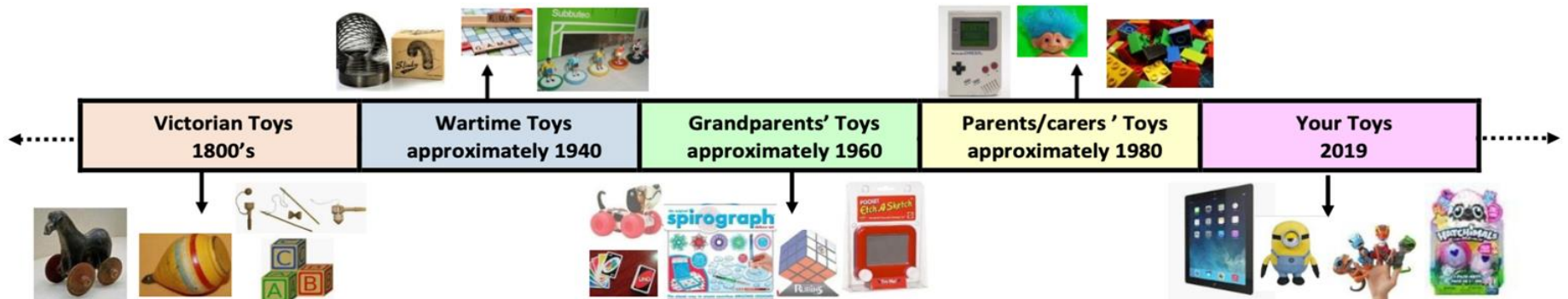


Toys Knowledge Mat

Sticky Knowledge- What do I need to know?

Week 1	Q- What are these toys? How do you know they are from the past. Where on the timeline will they fit? We can look at their appearance and the material to help us know they are from the past.
Week 2	Q - What are our toys like today? What is special about your favourite toy? Does it make a noise? Does it light up? We can use words such as exciting, fast, scary, squishy and cuddly to describe our toys.
Week 3	Q - How can we tell these toys are old? Toys from the past are different from toys from the present. Toys from the past are often made of metal and wood. Modern toys are often made from plastic.
Week 4	Q - Who played with these toys? The toys our Grandparents played with are very different to our modern ones. They were often made of wood and they did not have batteries.
Week 5	Q - Who played with these toys a long time ago. The children are from the Victorian period and lived in the 1800's. The period is named after Queen Victoria.
