| Physical Features | natural environment of an area, for example, water, soil, trees. |
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| Human Features | changes humans have made to an area, for example, buildings, |
| Environment | the surroundings or conditions in which a person, animal or plant live. |
| Town | a town is a place with many streets and buildings, where people live and work. Towns are larger than villages and smaller than cities. |
| Urban | an urban area is an area where many people live and work close together. It is where buildings are close together. Urban areas are usually cities and towns. |
