

St. Aidan's Primary School - A Church of England Academy <u>Pupil Premium Action Plan 2017-18</u>

At St. Aidan's C.E. Primary School, we believe that every child should be supported to achieve success academically and socially no matter what their social background, ensuring equity in overcoming barriers. The targeted and strategic use of the pupil premium grant will support school in raising the attainment of the most vulnerable pupils so that they are in line with, or exceeding age related expectations.

Using research and evidence (from the Sutton Trust and the EEF toolkits); meetings with educational experts (to gain advice and support) and knowledge of the context of the school through the analysis of RAISE online we propose to use the funding to:

- 1. Closing the gap between PP children and national attainment in RWM
- 2. Increase parental engagement
- 3. Raise pupil aspirations.

Identified barriers to educational achievement

We have identified the following barriers to learning for some of the pupils currently in receipt of Pupil Premium:

- Access to extra-curricular activities educational experiences such as trips, music lessons and participation in physical activities
- Parental engagement with school especially regarding completion of homework
- The number of pupils who are in receipt of Pupil Premium and also on the SEN register for cognition and learning
- Behaviour pupils with specific social and emotional needs which affect their learning
- Attainment gaps between pupil premium children and their peers
- Family circumstances that impact on the emotional literacy of the children.
