St. Aidan's & St. Anthony's Catholic Sixth Form has a strong heritage of providing first-rate education for generations of Sunderland's young people.

We are fortunate that we can draw the highly qualified and skilled teaching staff from across our two schools - St. Aidan's Catholic Academy and St. Anthony's Girls' Catholic Academy. This allows us to provide exceptional teaching, enrichment and pastoral care. It also allows us to offer a wide range of curriculum options - over 30 high quality courses. Students have the flexibility to study a combination of both traditional A Level and contemporary vocational qualifications.

Class sizes are smaller, giving more opportunity for bespoke help with academic studies. Subject teachers monitor student progress regularly and offer extra individual support.

Our students have their own designated facilities which allow them to thrive. Year 12 students are situated at Gabriel House and Year 13 students at the Briery.

We offer an extensive range of enrichment opportunities to complement our students' studies, and as a medium sized sixth form we offer highly focused pastoral support. Our students leave our care as resilient, confident and well-rounded individuals with the knowledge and skills needed to excel in adult life.





Pastoral Support

We offer students a high level of support as they meet the demandsplaced upon them by post 16 study and help them seamlessly bridge the gap between Year 11 and sixth form entry. We offer a team of dedicated and experienced form tutors, pastoral leads and a Head of Sixth Form who know each student as the individual they are.

Students will have a dedicated form tutor which means there is always someone who has a good knowledge of your skills, strengths and areas for development to advise you on career options and work habits.

Choosing the right course

1. Strengths

Have you discussed your preferred choice of subjects with your subject teachers? Do you feel comfortable with your chosen subjects at GCSE and are you able to continue with them to a higher level? Are you likely to get the subject specific grades required to access the course and succeed at Key Stage5?

2. Interest and Enjoyment

Have you demonstrated a genuine interest in a proposed subject? Can you think of ways you have shownyour interest outsideyour lessons? Pleaserefer to individual subject pages for detail on assessment and course content.

3. Career or HigherEducation Pathways

If you have a career or higher education course in mind, does your choice of subjects comply with the entry requirements of your chosen course? Have you researched currentrequirements from, for example, University websites and careers literature?

4. Skills

Do you know what sort of study the course contains e.g. does it involve practical work, coursework, numeracy, problem solving, essay writing, out of school activities? Do the skills you develop complement those in your other subjects?

Admissions

We welcome student's of all faiths and beliefs.

Admissions Requirements

- At least five grades grade 9-4, with a minimum of 3 GCSEs at grade 5.
- A minimum of a Grade 6 at GCSE in the subject they wish to study at A Level. A minimum of a Merit in the subject they want to study in Vocational Subjects.
- If a grade 4 is not achieved in Mathematics or English language, students must re-sit these exams alongside their level 3 qualifications.

Students will be offered a place at St. Aidan's & St. Anthony's Sixth Form on the proviso that they meet the criteria above, If students have not me the course entry requirements on GCSE results' day, staff will be available to support and advise students on their choices post 16.



How to apply

Applications for entry to St. Aidan's & St. Anthony's Sixth Form are welcomed from Year 11 students from St. Aidan's, St. Anthony's or any other academy or school from the City of Sunderland and surrounding areas, provided you meet admissions requirements.

Sixth Form Open evening

Our Sixth Form Open evening takes place in October and is an opportunity to visit subject departments, meet current students and get the advice that you need to choose the right courses for you that will take you in the right direction for your future.



Some students may be eligible for up to £1,200 of funding per year through the 16 to 19 Bursary Fund to pay for things they need to support their education. These may include a travel pass, books, clothing, equipment, trips to university open days and lunches.
