

Everything is a learning opportunity! In Hoy class, we needed to get some lunch from the shop so every member of the class walked to the shop and independently chose something they wanted for a snack.






The Glens

This is a FREE HOLIDAY CLUB designed for young people with SEND needs who are eligible for free school meals. It is part of the widely recognised Holiday and Activity Fund scheme funded by Derby City Council

Children who are eligible for free school meal will take priority however anyone can book as we now have paid for places at a reduced cost

Benefits for the students:

The students will be encouraged to:

Express their emotions and creativity.

- Work as a team and build friendships.
- Develop skills in dance, singing and song writing.
- Develop a deeper understanding of the impact of social media, exploring positive healthy usage.
- Learn coping mechanisms to deal with anxiety and stress.
- Increase confidence.
- Complete the 4 days with a huge sense of achievement and pride.
- Free Food, yummy snacks and drinks each day.
- Experience of working with highly trained industry professional from the creative industry

Due to the nature of our SEND Release Holiday programme, facilitators are unable to administer medicine or personal care to students attending. You are welcome to remain onsite and recoup in the CUBE café whilst your child is in the session.


