Headteacher's Welcome



I'm extremely pleased and very excited to share that we have managed to secure some funding to facilitate some refurbishment work over the Summer Holidays. St Andrew's pupil numbers have steadily grown over recent years, and whilst we've endeavoured to make the very most out of the space we have available, we require further refurbishment to meet the growing demand for places from Derby City Council.

In order to be ready for the new school year in September, that building work must commence at the earliest possible date. As a result, we have successfully applied for an *additional INSET* day which will mean that the school is closed on the last day of the year, Thursday 24th July 2025.

This was essential to allow our staff to clear areas of the school to enable the contractors to have clear access to the spaces that will be refurbished. Please accept my sincere apologies if

that has detrimentally affected you in any way. It is unprecedented for St Andrew's Academy to allocate an additional INSET in this way but a necessary step in order to give maximum opportunity for the works to be completed on time.

When it is available, more information will be shared on the amendments that are being made and the contemporary learning spaces and resources that will be available to all pupils in the new year.









Key Stage 4






Campus

On Wednesday residential students enjoyed a trip to Lees Brook Academy to watch their students perform in a production of the Roald Dahl classic, Matilda.




