Erin's Art Installation








Key Stage 3




In Key Stage 3, we have been continuing our learning of farming across the curriculum! We have been learning about the history of Farming in humanities, exploring non-fiction books about farming in English and listening to British folk music about farming in music plus much more! Learners have been excelling with learning new vocabulary through speech, symbols and signing- this has really shown an improvement in communication across the key stage!

Mull Class have had a fantastic week filled with exploration, creativity, and plenty of fun!

We began the week with a lively Math's session featuring a flour storm! Our challenge was to count how many flour towers we could build — and by the end, a few of us looked as though we'd stepped straight out of a snow globe!

Our sensory circuits have also been a highlight, especially with the introduction of our brandnew trampette. The pupils have absolutely loved the extra bounce it brings to their sessions. We also explored sensory trays inspired by environments from around the world, including the jungle, the ocean, the Arctic, and the desert — a fantastic way to spark curiosity and imagination.

Mid-week took us into the world of farming as we tried our hand at sheep shearing and corn making. A lot of the "corn" (otherwise known as Cheerios!) mysteriously disappeared along the way — but that's all part of the fun!

In Music, we've been exploring folk music, and our folk dancing skills are really beginning to shine. It's been wonderful to see everyone joining in with such enthusiasm.


































The Highlands















This week in class, we have been learning about Remembrance Day. The students took part in an engaging Attention Autism session inspired by the poem *In Flanders Fields*. They listened to music, watched a short film, and reflected on the meaning of remembrance. To finish, the students enjoyed creating beautiful poppies using a variety of materials.

This week in Taransay we have been looking at personal hygiene and why it's important we keep are selfs clean. Students are learning how to wash their hands effectively. Students have been reaching their own individual targets. Some of the students have been having their hair washed, learning how to put deodorant on and how to take care of themselves.
