




Therapy Input




Some students have been focusing on hand strengthening exercises during our sessions. Hand and wrist strength is crucial when it comes to writing, holding a pen, cooking and dressing skills.

We achieve this by engaging in activities such as traversing across a climbing wall, or propelling yourself down the corridor on a scooter board using your hands. We also combine the sensory circuit with fine motor activities to increase the strengthening input as well as proprioception which calms our nervous system \bigcirc













Extra Curricular
