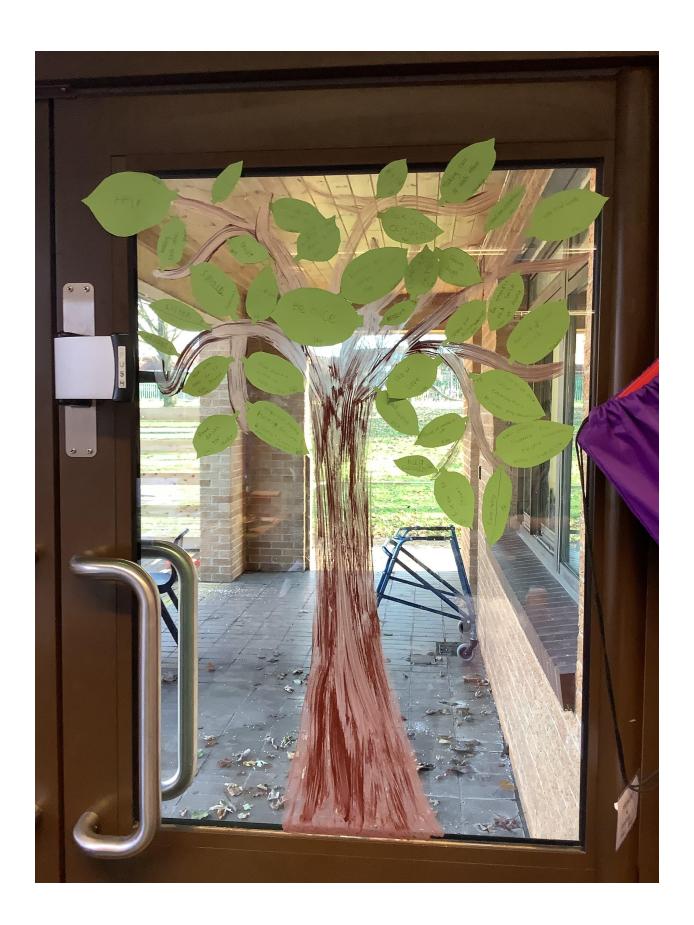




The Glens




Occupational Therapy

Residential Department



Student Voice




