Key Stage 3










The Glens

The Highlands

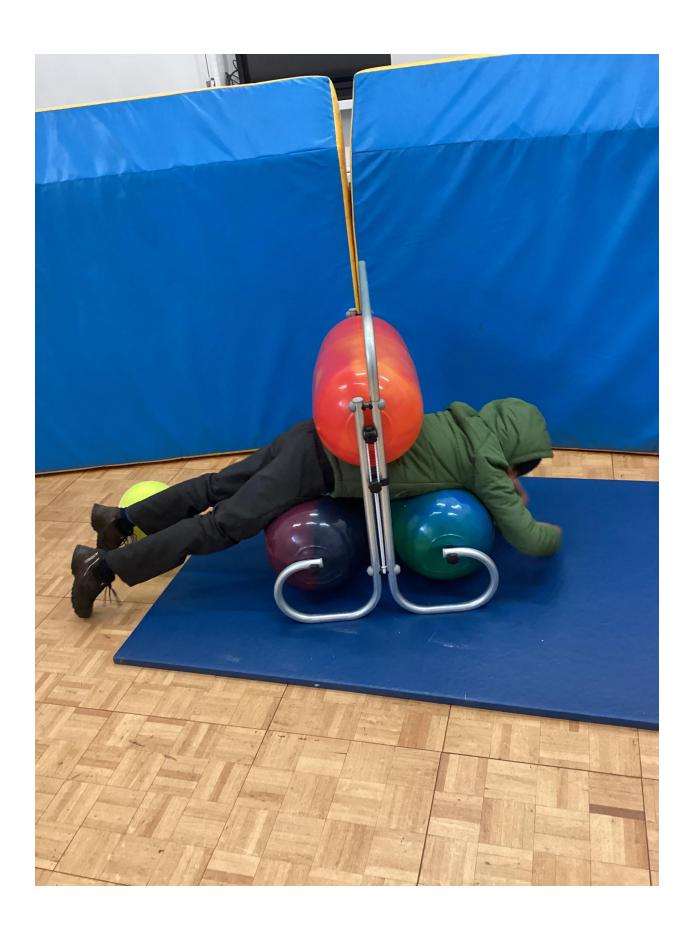
