


Skye students have been practicing their writing skills this week. They used the interactive whiteboard to over write first name initials. Great work Skye Class.

#### St Andrews Academy Awarded School Games GOLD Mark for 2024/25

We are delighted to share that St Andrews Academy has been awarded the *School Games GOLD Mark* for the 2024/25 academic year. This national accolade recognises our school's outstanding commitment to physical education, inclusive sport, and community engagement.

Over the past year, we have made significant strides in promoting sport for all, including:

- Launching the Multi Schools League, in collaboration with 11 SEND schools across Derbyshire and Staffordshire. This initiative provided 79 of our pupils with opportunities to compete in inter-school sporting events.
- **Partnering with Derby County Community Trust** to design and participate in inclusive events such as the SEND MEGAFEST.
- **Recognising the incredible efforts** of our pupils, young leaders, volunteers, and sports officials, whose hard work and dedication were instrumental to our success. We met key

criteria in areas including participation, competition, student leadership, and school-club links—highlighting the strength and spirit of our school community.

We are incredibly proud of this achievement and look forward to building on this success in the coming year.










## The Highlands
















Another week goes by and yet another busy time up in the Highlands.

In Taransay we have two main focuses this week, The Wizard of Oz and modes of transport. We have been linking the parts of the book to certain sentences and pictures that relate to the Wizard of Oz. Then when it comes to modes of transport we have been linking each of the modes of transport to their relevant pictures or models.

In Jura we have been looking at the topic of Heavy and Light, doing this through a Tactile Treasure Hunt. We would do this by finding buried objects and then having to identify if they are either heavy, or lighter objects and the differences between the two. How very adventurous, fun and scientific.

In Iona we have been looking at independent life skills and their related EHCP, such as going out and getting our own snacks or ingredients as well as making our own cups of tea. It has been really enjoyable and great to see the pupils being so involved in their life skills. Therapy Input


Students are encouraged to explore challenging foods through play, so they learn they can have positive relationships with foods.

#### Apply Now for September School Transport

A reminder to parents; if your child is moving up to Post 16 education in September (Year 11, 12 and 13) please complete your child's home to school transport application as soon as possible

At St Andrew's Academy, most of our students are dropped off and collected from school via mini bus or taxi. These services are provided and arranged independently by Derby City Council or your child's Local Authority (if outside of the City Council). **If your child will be moving up to post-16 education**, now is the time to apply.
